# UKRAINIAN PRESS IN CANADA by Danylo Lobay Translated and revised by Olenka Negrych

This survey of the Ukrainian-Canadian press was made by Danylo Lobay in 1960 and published in the "Jubilee Almanac to commemorate the Fiftieth Anniversary of Ukrainian Voice, 1910-1960", Winnipeg, 1960, p. 130-140. It was brought up to date to include periodicals which appeared after 1960 or such which were omitted by the author. This is not an exhaustive coverage of the Ukrainian-Canadian press, although it does include most of the important periodicals published. For a bibliography of Ukrainian-Canadian press surveys see the article by J. B. Rudnyc'kyj in "Papers of the Bibliographical Society of Canada", II, Toronto, 1963, p. 74-78.
