Mirchuk, Ivan. UKRAINE AND ITS PEOPLE: A Handbook With Maps, Statistical Tables and Diagrams. Munich, Ukrainian Free University, 1949. 280 p.

A useful basic reference work on the history, eco-

nomy and culture of Ukraine.

UKRAINE: A CONCISE ENCYCLOPAEDIA. Edited by Volodymyr Kubijovyč. Toronto, University of To-

ronto Press, 1963. 1215 p.

This new encyclopaedia, prepared by leading Ukrainian scholars in the Western world, is the single most valuable work on Ukraine and its people. Profusely illustrated, it features the history, geography and ethnography of Ukraine as well as Ukrainian literature, language and culture. It has lengthy monograph-type articles on these subjects, to which a detailed index offers complete access. Published November, 1963, it is an up to date and authoritative reference work.

A vivid, brief sketch of Ukrainian history by an American expert.

Chirovsky, N. L. Fr. — OLD UKRAINE; Its Socio-Economic History Prior to 1781. Madison, N. J., Florham Park Press, 1963. 432 p.

The author, an American professor of economics, traces Ukraine's social and economic history from pre-historic times to 1800.

Doroshenko, Demetrio. HISTORIA DE UCRANIA. Buenos Aires, Representacion Central Ucrania, 1962. 687 p.

A Spanish translation of Doroshenko's comprehen-

sive history of Ukraine.

Doroshenko, Dmytro. A SURVEY OF UKRAINIAN HISTORIOGRAPHY. New York, Ukrainian Academy of Arts and Sciences in the U.S., 1957. 456 p.

A valuable scholary account of the historians and historical sources of Ukraine. One-third of the book is devoted to O. Ohloblyn's essay, "Ukrainian Historiography: 1917-1956."

Doroshenko, Dmytro. HISTORY OF THE UKRAINE. Edmonton, Hrushevsky Institute, 1939. 686 p.

A good survey of Ukrainian history by a leading historian who taught in Canada for some time.

Fedenko, Panas. UKRAINE: HER STRUGGLE FOR FREEDOM. Augsburg, Free Ukraine, 1951. 80 p.

A sketch of Ukrainian history by a well known

Ukrainian writer Mr. Abregé de l'highire de l'Ukrait Hruchevsky, Michel. COURS D'HISTOIRE DE L'UK-RAINE. Paris, Premiere Imprimerie Ukrainienne en France, 1959. 241 p.

An authoritative, concise history by the most

famous Ukrainian historian.

Hrushevsky, Michael. A HISTORY OF UKRAINE. New Haven, Yale University Press, 1941. 629 p.

One of the finest histories of Ukraine by the greatest Ukrainian historian. This book is the essence of his monumental ten-volume HISTORY OF UK-RAINE-RUS', which was based on primary sources. This work is the foundation of Ukrainian historiography. The works of Prof. Hrushevsky (1866-1934) are banned in the Soviet Union.

A well illustrated survey of Ukrainian history, with emphasis on the role of the Church. The author is a Ukrainian Catholic priest in the United States.

Scheggia, Angelina. HISTORIA DE UCRANIA. Madrid, Centro de Estudios Orientales, 1963. 127 p.

A useful general outline of the history of Ukraine in Spanish.

Tisserand, Roger. LA VIE D'UN PEUPLE: L'UKRAINE. Paris, Librairie Orientale et Americaine, 1933. 298 p.

Gives a clear picture of the development of the Ukrainian people.

Yowles, Hugh P. UKRAINE AND ITS PEOPLE. London, W. & R. Chambers, 1939. 224 p.

A readable general account, partly confused and unreliable.

SPECIAL HISTORY

Adams, Arthur E. BOLSHEVIKS IN THE UKRAINE: The Second Campaign, 1918-1919. New Haven, Yale University Press, 1963, 440 p.

A very detailed scholarly work which deals with eight important months of Ukrainian history.

Armstrong, John A. UKRAINIAN NATIONALISM. 1939-1945. 2. rev. ed. New York, Columbia University Press, 1963, 361 p.

An objective and reliable account of Ukraine's national movement during the war.

ASPECTS OF CONTEMPORARY UKRAINE. Prepared at the University of Chicago. New Haven, Human Relations Area Files, 1955. 505 p.

A comprehensive preliminary survey, not completely satisfactory.

Borys, Jurij. THE RUSSIAN COMMUNIST PARTY AND THE SOVIETIZATION OF UKRAINE: A Study in the Communist Doctrine of the Self-determination of Nations. Stockholm, 1960. 374 p.

Budurowycz, Bohdan B. POLISH - SOVIET RE-EATIONS, 1932-1939. New York, Columbia University Press, 1963. 229 p.

A detailed, documented study which includes Ukraine because its territory was split by the Polish-

Soviet border between the wars.

Chevalier, Pierre. A DISCOURSE OF THE ORIGINAL, COUNTRY, MANNERS, GOVERNMENT AND RELI-GION OF THE COSSACKS. Translated by Edward Browne, London, H. Kemp, 1672, 195 p.

Describes the Ukrainian Cossacks and their wars against Poland up to 1651. Original edition in French,

The head of the Ukrainian government 1918-20,

Simon Petlura was assassinated in 1926 by a Soviet agent in Paris who was Jewish. He accused Petlura of mistreating the Jews. This book, by Desroches, a French Jew, clears Petlura's reputation.

Dmytryshyn, Basil. MOSCOW AND THE UKRAINE, 1918-1953; A Study of Russian Bolshevik Nationality Policy. New York, Bookman Associates, 1956.

A detailed and scholarly analysis of Moscow's nationality policy regarding Ukraine.

Ewach, Honore. UKRAINE'S CALL TO AMERICA. Detroit, Ukrainian Cultural Society, 1947. 172 p.

A popular account of Ukrainian history, culture, language and literature.

Grekov, B. D. KIEV RUS'. Moscow, Foreign Languages Publishing House, 1959. 684 p.

A history and description of the ancient state centered on Kiev, the capital of Ukraine. Grekov, a leading Russian historian, considers early Kiev history (800-1240) to be Russian rather than Ukrainian.

Horak, Stephan. POLAND AND HER NATIONAL MINORITIES, 1919-1939. New York, Vantage Press, 1961. 259 p.

Includes much on the Ukrainians who were Poland's largest minority.

A documented study of the German occupation of Ukraine, vital to an accurate understanding of World War II.

This study fully examines the Nazi Lebensraum policy toward Eastern Europe.

A documentary outline of the main facts about the concentration camps in the USSR, especially in the post-Stalin period. ne post-stalin period.

The commentary of a leader of the Ukrainian Jews who was a minister of the Government and a delegate of the Ukrainian Republic to the Versailles Peace Conference and the League of Nations. Valuable inside information on the politics of the West regarding Ukraine and the USSR.
