THE DOUBLE-FACED POLICY

While Soviet Russian propaganda with the help of multi-national ensembles and exhibitions as well as tourism and trade missions, is portraying the Soviet Union as a country where national and cultural freedom is respected, many thousands of patriots of the enslaved nations are languishing behind bars or barbed wire for trying to preserve their national identity, language and culture; and most of all for the right to worship without harassment and persecution.

While the Soviet Russian Government is actively supporting almost every so-called national liberation movement in the world, any suggestion of freedom and independence for Ukraine and other non-Russian nations in the USSR is most brutally suppressed.

NATIONALITY PROBLEM

For external propaganda, the USSR is being presented as the only country in the world which has successfully solved the nationality problem. In practice, however, the non-Russian nations in the USSR are being systematically annihilated by genocide and ethnocide, even more now than during the Stalin period. They are being forced to abandon their language, their culture and their national identity, so that they would ultimately be absorbed into a Russian nation. As a result of this brutal policy, millions of Ukrainians, Byelorussians, Estonians, Latvians, Lithuanians, Georgians, Turkestanis and others were physically liquidated during the 60 years of Bolshevik rule. Unbelievable as it may sound, but it is a fact.
