FREEDOM FOR UKRAINE!

All people and nations of good will acknowledge that freedom, justice and national independence is the basis of elementary rights and the prerogative of every human being and nation in this world. The 47 million Ukrainian nation, brutally enslaved and physically mutilated by Russia, also has these rights. In recent years Moscow has violated these rights by annihilating Ukrainian intellectuals and destroying, in various ways, the national culture and education.

In the years 1927-1938 and onwards, Russia has annihilated over 80% of the Ukrainian educational elite. Between 1965-1967, the KGB sent over 300 Ukrainian poets, writers, critics, translators, judges and lawyers to concentration camps. From January to early May 1972, on the orders of the Central Committee of the Communist Party in the USSR, the KGB arrested over 100 Ukrainian educational and cultural workers. Such terror and imprisonments still continue.

Available documents and numerous witnesses without any doubt confirm that Ukrainian people, in the cultural and educational field, tortured, imprisoned and terrorized in the past and those suffering at present are all victims of the consciously planned terroristic politics and policies of the Soviet regime. This policy, carried out by the KGB, is aimed at destroying the national and cultural wealth of Ukraine.

This is why recently arrested people, — such as I. Svitlychny, I. Dzyuba, E. Sverstyuk, V. Chornovil, I. Stasiv and hundreds of others, — are accused of so-called "offences", which in fact are prepared provocations, planned out beforehand in the cabinets and later fulfilled in the KGB torture chambers. Even that which is theoretically allowed, in accordance with the Soviet Constitution, is treated as an offence, eg. Article 125, which guarantees freedom of speech, the holding of public meetings and manifestations, and Article 17 which guarantees the right of every Republic to freely opt out of the Union of Soviet Socialist Republics and live independently.

Their "offences" were in fact that in accordance with the Soviet Constitution and United Nations Charter, they protested against the violent russification in Ukraine, against the crimes of the Soviet authorities and stood in defence of the Ukrainian national culture, justified national freedom and human dignity, enjoyed by all people in democratic countries and civilised nations of the world.

Therefore, we strongly appeal to all people of good will, to whom God and the human ideals of Freedom, Democracy and Justice are so dear, to unanimously stand in defence of subjugated, persecuted nations and people, imprisoned by Russian tyranny and to condemn the terroristic-imperialistic policies of Moscow in Ukraine.

Support our demand that the Soviet Union immediately stop its politics of destroying nations; that it stop suppressing the creative thoughts, talents, ideas and persecuting the freedom guaranteed by the UN Charter; that it stop arresting Ukrainian educational and cultural workers and that it allow all those people forcefully banished into exile, to return to their homeland.

Help the 47 million strong Ukrainian nation, which is justified in its struggle to attain complete freedom and independence.

Safeguard your own freedom and join us in appealing in this cause to all governments, humanitarian, political and other institutions in defence of individual and national rights.
