KGB HAS GONE BERSERK! STOP RUSSIAN ORGY!

OVER 100 ARRESTED IN UKRAINE!

In January 1972 and later, over 100 people were arrested by the KGB in Ukraine. The arrests occurred mainly in Kiev, the capital of Ukraine, and Lviv, the largest city in Western Ukraine.

The latest victims of the KGB, arrested in April and May 1972. are the following renown persons: Ivan Dzyuba - a well-known literary critic, Yuriy Shukhevych - son of the late Commanderin-Chief of the Ukrainian Insurgent Army, Roman Shukhevych, Nadya Svitlychna - librarian, and Zinoviya Franko - the granddaughter of the famous Ukrainian poet Ivan Franko.

Those arrested are people leading ordinary family lives, practising their professions as labourers, poets, artists, critics, intellectuals, technicians, etc. In their everyday lives, they firmly express their thoughts and ideas and stand up for what they believe. For this they are persecuted. Instead of conforming to the wishes of the Soviet Authorities, they are more determined in their cultural activities and forms of self-expression which in turn has strengthened their national consciousness. They explain the Russian suppression and persecution as trying to wipe out the important significance of Ukraine and for what it stands.

Those arrested are fully aware that the only thing that awaits them for their determination is physical, mental and psychological torture in a prison, a concentration camp or a mental asylum. They ar aware that they may be giving up 10 or 15 years of their lives for their actions but they reckon this to be more worthy than to live as a puppet of the Soviet Russian regime.
