Theme and Variations

The exhibition surveys Ihor Dmytruk's paintings of the last four years, his exploration of the pure intellectual problems of edge and form. It is not a mathematical division of space but an intuitive one, based on acute awareness of nuance and balance. The paintings are cool and cerebral, a dispassionate manipulation of a chosen module, sliced, turned, interrupted.

Lately, the paintings seem more plastic and sensual; colour warms the clean geometry. Dmytruk creates tension between the active three-dimensional illusion and colour which emphasizes the flatness of the painting surface. The earlier paintings share this tension: vibrating groups of modules played against an intensely luminous background. Light escapes in narrow slots from behind austere forms.

This exhibition of work by Ihor Dmytruk is part of series of one-man exhibitions of Edmonton artists being organized by the Edmonton Art Gallery. I would like to thank the lenders to this exhibition and those who have helped in its organization.




















Ihor Dmytruk
