INTRODUCTION

The publication of this book happily coincides with two remarkable events: the 90th anniversary of Ukrainian settlement in Canada, and the 105th anniversary of Ukrainian settlement in the United States.

Although the first Ukrainian presence on North American soil has been recorded as early as 1608—Ivan Bohdan from Kolomeia came together with the legendary Captain John Smith to Jamestown, Virginia—and some Ukrainians fought during the American Revolutionary and Civil Wars, the bulk of Ukrainian immigrants arrived later in successive waves. The first immigrant wave came to America during the years 1876 to 1890. Three other waves (1895—1918, 1920—40, 1946—55) brought thousands of new immigrants to Canada and the United States.

Ukrainian immigrants were driven from their native places (Galicia, Bukovina, Carpatho-Ruthenia, Ukraine) by precarious political, social, and economic conditions. (Ukrainians were known and recorded in the past under various names: Ruthenians, Rusyns, Rusniaks, Little Russians, as well as under regional names such as Carpatho-Ruthenians, Lemkos, Boykos, Hutsuls, Galitzians, and Bukovinians. To this day, the Carpatho-Ruthenians, consider themselves a separate ethnic group which embraces immigrants from Carpatho-Ukraine and the Lemkian Region.) Oppressed by czarist Russia, exploited in the Astro-Hungarian empire, and later subjugated by other foreign powers, Ukrainian immigrants came to America and Canada to seek political freedom and better economic and social opportunities.

Presently it is estimated that there are about 2 million Ukrainian Americans and about 600,000 Ukrainian Canadians. The majority are of Catholic (Byzantine Rite) faith. The rest consist mostly of Eastern Orthodox believers and some Protestant groups. Their native language is Ukrainian, a Slavic language, spoken in several speech patterns reflecting regional differences. Ukrainian Canadians and Americans are hard workers, modest, creative, and made important contributions in both countries, especially in the fields of agriculture, engineering, education, science, sports, film, and politics. During World War I and World War II, thousands of Ukrainians joined the U.S. and Canadian armed forces, and hundreds gave their lives for the cause of democracy and freedom.

Ukrainian Canadians and Americans have a strong feeling of national and cultural identity; they are proud of their ethnic culture and heritage and are motivated by a desire to see their native land, Ukraine, a free, independent, and democratic country.

Introduction

The present volume is an endeavor to assemble and present for the first time a comprehensive guide on the subject of Ukrainians in Canada and the United States—their collective experience as well as individual achievements and contributions—by combining extensive annotated bibliographies with several directories. The bibliographic section contains almost one thousand annotated entries (books, dissertations, periodical articles, pamphlets) culled from both English and Ukrainian sources on a selective basis. Many items are rare and not well known by researchers. The directories list 175 national organizations, more than 550 churches (Catholic, Eastern Orthodox, Protestant), one hundred periodical publications (active and retrospective), and ninety publishing houses and bookstores both in Canada and the United States.

The majority of titles are in English. Ukrainian titles are transliterated in Latin and accompanied by English translations. Annotations are generally descriptive. The bibliographic information for each entry contains author (or editor, compiler, etc.), title, and facts of publication. Each entry of the guide has been assigned an entry number. The entry numbers use a letter which refers to the main parts (e.g., A to "General Reference Works on Ukrainian Topics", B to "Ukrainian Immigration, Settlement and Contributions in Canada and the United States"). Within each part, items are numbered consecutively (e.g., A-1, A-2, etc.), thus easily identifiable by researchers.

It is hoped that this book will prove helpful to ethnic scholars, teachers, researchers, students, and other interested persons, and will also stimulate further research and publication on the subject of Ukrainians in Canada and the United States. Readers' comments are welcome for improvements of future editions.


