Shevchenko Scientific Society

The Shevchenko Scientific Society was founded in Lviv, Western Ukraine, in 1873 and honors the great Ukrainian poet, Taras Shevchenko (1814-1861). The Society has devoted itself to promoting a free and independent scholarship.

Before World War I, the Society became the unofficial Ukrainian Academy of Arts and Sciences. It possessed a large library, a museum, and its own printing plant. Before World War II, it published over one thousand works.

After the outbreak of World War II and the annexation of Western Ukraine to Soviet Ukraine, the Soviet government disbanded the Shevchenko Scientific Society. In the course of the war, a majority of the Society's members escaped to the West and reestablished the Society in Western Europe, the United States, Canada, and Australia.

This catalog, containing over 200 publications, demonstrates the Society's further growth and development in the West in the post-World War II period.

The number in parenthesis indicates the sequence of entries in this catalog. The number following this refers to the specific Shevchenko Society series.
