Introduction

Genealogically valuable documents about 19th century Russian Jews may be found in countless collections held by archives of the former Soviet Union. Locating them, however, is often difficult. This monograph details a number of important collections of 19th and early 20th records about Jews created in the region that today is Ukraine, as well as a small amount of material dating back as far as the 16th century.

Most of the material comes from the State Historical Archives in Kiev, the regional archives in Zhitomir, the State Historical Archives in Lviv and a related collection entitled "Collection from Beyond the Bug River", the so-called Zabuzanski archive held in Warsaw. Scattered holdings from other Ukrainian archives are listed as well. The lists from Kiev and Lviv, as well as the records in Warsaw, primarily describe vital records.

The inventory for the Zhitomir archives inventory is the most thorough of those presented, although the combined inventory of vital statistics records of Jews in the Lviv archives and in the Zabuzanski collection in Warsaw probably represents most of the extant records in its category. Data is presented geographically according to the town where the documents were created.

Country boundaries have changed frequently over the past two centuries in the part of the world known today as Ukraine. So also have administrative districts within countries. Provenance determines where records are to be kept. That is, international archival standards mandate that records be held in the archives of the country that today governs the land where the records were created. For example, some records created during the 19th century in what was then Austrian Galicia are today held in the Ukrainian State Historical Archives in Lviv.

Wars, revolutions, fire, neglect and simple human error have taken their toll on the records from this region. Many have been lost. Others are not found where one would expect them to be. Researchers of this area must discard any notion that record keeping is an exact science. Many a slip has occurred between an official plan for record storage and what actually exists today. Many records created in communities that are part of Ukraine today, as noted above, currently are stored in archives in Warsaw, Poland.

Historical Geography

As a result of the three partitions of Poland in 1772, 1775 and 1795, until the end of World War I, the land that today is Ukraine was divided between the Russian Empire and the Austro-Hungarian Empire. Archival collections in contemporary Ukraine reflect this historical division. The country has two State Historical Archives; one is in Kiev, the other is in Lviv (formerly Lemberg, Lwow or Lvov).

Austrian Rule: Records from Lviv and the Zabuzanski Collection

In the three partitions of Poland, Austria acquired southeastern Poland, which it named Galicia. The capital of the eastern portion of Galicia was Lemberg, then Lwow, Lvov and today Lviv. (Krakow was the capital of western

Galicia.] In 1939, the Soviet Union acquired East Galicia and made it part of the Ukrainian Soviet Socialist Republic. With the dissolution of the Soviet Union, all territory within the Ukrainian SSR became the independent country of Ukraine; the former East Galicia is now part of western Ukraine.

The province of Bukovina, with its capital at Chernovitsy, was the eastern-most province of the Austrian monarchy. From 1786 until 1840, Bukovina was administered as a part of Galicia. In 1861, Chernovitsy was made the capital of the province. Today, the northernmost portion of the former Bukovina is part of Ukraine. (The southern portion belongs to the republic of Moldova.)

As a result of different regimes, archival records kept in the portion of Ukraine that once was either Galicia or Bukovina are written in German or Polish and use the Roman alphabet. Archival records created in the former czarist empire are written in Russian with the Cyrillic alphabet.

Several times throughout the 19th century, the Austrian government tried to require that civil birth, marriage, divorce and death records be kept by state-appointed rabbis, but the attempts often were unsuccessful. In 1875 a law standardized the recording process, however, and with minor alterations it remained in effect until the end of Austrian rule in the region after World War I.

The 1875 law divided Galicia into 74 major administrative districts, most of which were further subdivided into smaller subdistricts. All but the largest districts incorporated a number of smaller surrounding communities. In this way, all towns where Jews lived were covered for the purposes of registration.

Between 1962 and 1964 some 19th century vital statistics records created in East Galicia were transferred to the Polish archives in Warsaw. Collectively, they are known as the *Zabuzanski* collection, e.g., the "collection from beyond the Bug River." In some cases, vital statistics records for a single town in western Ukraine are divided between the Lviv archives and the Warsaw archives. Bialy Kamen is an example; its birth, marriage and death records for some years are held in Warsaw; those for other years are found in the Lviv archives.

Because of the nature of the Austrian record collection districts, records for a few towns that are in Poland (and not in Ukraine) also are kept in the *Zabuzanski* Collection. For example, the town of Lubycza Krolewska is in Poland, but during the 19th century it was part of a district for which Rawa Ruska was the district center and collection point for the Jewish vital records of that district. Today Rawa Ruska is part of Ukraine and is the center of a district by that name. Because the Jewish records for Lubycza Krolewska were kept in Rawa Ruska, they are found in the *Zabuzanski* collection in Warsaw. The same is true of records for Wielkie Oczy, Poland.

Records of all towns within a single district usually were combined in a single volume in the order in which the events occurred. For example, the books of births, marriages and deaths for the town of Bobrka included records from the subdistrict towns of Berezdivtsi, Khodoriv, Mykolaiv and Strilichi novi. The latter are not listed separately.

All communities designated as administrative districts had at least one officially appointed rabbi whose job it was to maintain vital records for the Austrian government. Nevertheless, Jews resisted civil registration for two major reasons. Until 1831, Austrian law had limited Jewish marriage to the eldest son only, making the populace very suspicious of government regulation

even many years after that rule was abolished. Long after Jews had accepted the registration of births and deaths as a matter for state concern, they continued to resist increasing government pressure to have civil marriages. A child born to a couple married only religiously was not supposed to be registered as legitimate. In some cases, the name of the father was omitted from the register. Further, the child was barred from inheriting his father's property. As a result of this situation, which was enforced with increasing harshness in the late 19th and early 20th centuries, marriage registers are very thin compared to the thick books registering births and deaths.

After World War I, census and tax records of the Jews of Galicia, as well as copies of birth, marriage and death records remained in the Lviv archives. Between 1962 and 1964, as part of a records exchange agreement, the Soviets transferred to Warsaw some Jewish birth, marriage and death records for some of the communities in the territory of the former East Galicia.

Presumably, records of censuses taken by the Austrians, tax, name change and other genealogical important records are still in the Lviv archives (Fond 44).

Births, marriages and deaths were recorded in individual ledgers in the order in which they occurred. Forms were printed in German, and events were recorded in handwritten Polish. Generally these were separate books. The time span recorded in each book varied widely with the population and number of events. Many books include indexes, but some large communities had separate index books. Although the forms changed slightly over time, the types of information collected always included names, addresses, dates of the event, names of parents and witnesses, and a wide column on the right for remarks or special circumstances.

If You Cannot Find a Town Listed for Austria-Era Records

Because of the way vital records were collected in the Austrian Empire, the names of many smaller communities may not appear in these lists, even though they actually exist. Town names given in the Lviv archives collection and in the Zabuzanski collection were all either district or subdistrict collection centers. All vital records for communities within a single district or subdistrict were collected in the town that was designated as the collection point for that district. Many more Galician towns not listed here had Jewish populations, and records for those towns exist today. They were the small towns that *were not* record collection centers. If you do not find the name of a town of interest listed here, assume only that it was not a district or subdistrict center. Determine which town was the collection center for your community, and look for your town's records in that district or subdistrict town. To ascertain the district or subdistrict to which a particular community belonged, consult the Galician Town and Administrative Districts microfiche produced by Avotaynu, Inc. (P.O. Box 900, Teaneck, NJ 07666).

Records from the Imperial Russian Empire

Throughout the 19th century, Czarist Russia was divided into *guberniyas* and *uezds*. Guberniyas roughly correspond to provinces while an *uezd*, a subdivision of a guberniya, was similar in size to the American county and is frequently described as a "district" in English-language publications. *Guberniyas* were abolished in 1919 after the Bolshevik Revolution and replaced by a system of

oblasts, and *raions*. An *oblast* may be thought of as akin to one of the 50 states of the United States of America. The smallest unit, *raion* is like an American township. The Polish term that corresponded to *uezd* was *woyevodstvo*; it is mentioned in some references below.

Ukraine has 28 oblasts, each of which has an oblast archive. Most genealogically relevant records are kept in oblast level repositories. The State Archives of Zhitomir oblast is one example. Above these regional archives are the two state historical archives in Kiev and Lviv. Kiev has both a state historical archive and a different archive of Kiev oblast. Nineteenth century vital statistics records created in the region that became Kiev oblast should be found in Kiev oblast archives. Instead, they are held in the state historical archives.

The Spelling of Town Names

The spelling of town names conforms to *Where Once We Walked*, which reflects the 1991 official version of the U.S. Board on Geographic Names (BGN). Sometimes the town names were spelled differently in the information given the authors .

In records created in former Czarist territories, names are written in Russian with Cyrillic letters. In some cases, archivists and others transliterated town names somewhat differently from methods used by the BGN. In those cases, the BGN version of the name is followed by a slash mark and then the alternate spelling. When requesting records, it is wise to include both spellings. If requesting information about a town whose name would have been written in Russian, try to include that name as well. Current bilingual maps of Ukraine are a good source for town names written in both Roman and Cyrillic letters. One is available from Avotaynu. Not all 19th century towns are shown on current maps, but most are.

An asterisk following a town name indicates that the name is not listed in WOWW. In such cases, the spelling was supplied by the source of that information. Sometimes the source was archivists from the repository holding the data; in other cases, the source was one of the various researchers. When supplied by a source, the name of the district (*uezd*) in which the town is located follows in parentheses.

Types of Records Listed

Genealogists learn early the value of so-called “vital” records—the accounts of births, marriages, divorces and deaths. They and the *reviskie skazki* (fiscal censuses) are well known to most Jewish genealogists. Less well known, but often equally valuable, are other categories of records, many of which are alien to westerners not accustomed to totalitarian rule. A multitude of them were created in 19th century Austro-Hungary and Czarist Russia. Following are the categories of records listed in this monograph. Just because a record of interest is not listed does not necessarily mean that it does not exist. No attempt has been made at comprehensiveness. Many archives with rich Jewish collections are not represented because detailed information from them is not yet available. This monograph only represents what is known now about holdings from Ukrainian towns. Later publications will include information about additional

records. Record types are indicated by abbreviation in the list. The key to these abbreviations is presented on the following page.

Vital Records

Vital records are birth, marriage, divorce and death records. In 1826, the imperial czarist government issued a requirement that rabbis keep registration books of births, marriages, divorces and deaths. Prior to that time, Jews kept only such records as Jewish law and custom required, for example, circumcision records for boys, but nothing like birth records for girls; the *ketubbah* (marriage contract) and *get* (divorce decrees); and the *pinkassim* (registers) of the *chevrot kadisha* (Jewish burial societies). After 1826, Jews were required to go to the synagogue to which they were assigned (all were assigned someplace in Czarist Russia) and to register vital events. Once a year, the authorities went to the synagogues to copy these registers. The materials stored in archives today are all copies; the original records kept in synagogues no longer exist. They were destroyed no later than 1942, primarily by the Germans, although some likely perished earlier during the anti-religious actions of the Bolshevik government during the 1920s and 1930s.

Reviskie Skazki

Reviskie skazki (often called revision lists) are a series of ten taxation and conscription censuses purposes started by czarist authorities in the middle of the 18th century. The Russian Empire had almost no Jewish inhabitants at the time of the three partitions of Poland, however, so Jewish genealogists will find virtually nothing of value in revisions before 1795, the first revision taken after the Polish partitions and, thus, the first revision in which Jews appear. Unfortunately, most Polish-Russian Jews did not have family names in 1795. Fixed, hereditary family names for Jews were not mandated by the Russian government until 1809; with the exception of some rabbinic and other notable lines, most Jewish families did not adopt surnames until required to do so. Only revisions taken after 1809 are useful for most Jewish genealogists.

The *reviskie skazki* were organized by family and listed (by name and age) the head of the household, spouse and children. Jewish revision lists usually, but not always, were kept separately from Christian lists. Because the lists were used for conscription, and army service was an especially onerous ordeal for the Jews, every effort was made to keep males from being recorded. This was especially true during the reign of Nicholas I (1825–55), during which Jewish boys as young as eight years of age were drafted for up to 25 years. Revisions V (1795), VI (1811) and VII (1815) are known to be especially inaccurate, with many missing males (but only males were recorded in the sixth revision).

Reviskie skazki for individual towns usually were kept in registers created for an entire uezd. Researchers should examine registers for the corresponding uezd if revision lists do not appear under the town name sought. This is especially true when searching records in the Zhitomir oblast archives.

Other Records

Sprinkled throughout this monograph in the record column are notations of other categories of records listed only as financial, police, military, etc. Without inspecting each file, the exact nature of these miscellaneous categories of records cannot be known precisely. It is known that some researchers of Jewish genealogy have found valuable information in them. Listed below are the abbreviations used to denote the various categories of records.

Description of Columns on Listing

The inventory listing that follows has seven columns. Their meaning is:

1. Year(s) for which there are record.
2. Record Type. See the section “Abbreviation for Record Categories” for the various types of documents listed.
- 3–5. Fond/Delo(a)/Opis. Archival designations. See the following paragraph for a detailed descriptions of these terms.
6. Archival Location. See list of locations below.
7. Comments. Additional information supplied about records.

Fond, *opis* and *delo* are archival designations of the record storage system that enable an archivist in the former Soviet system to retrieve records, much as a librarian relies upon a cataloguing system. A *fond* corresponds to a record group; an *opis* is an inventory of a subset of records within a specific fond and a *delo* is a file within an opis. Each file may consist of many pages or simply a single sheet of paper. If a category of information is not included for a specific town, this means that the data was not supplied to the authors. The column entitled “notes” supplies additional information where known. In the case of the records in Lviv, the numbers listed in the “notes” column may, in fact, be delo listings. Because the references supplied were ambiguous, this could not be determined definitively. Where an alternate spelling appears in the “notes” column, this indicates the spelling used in the Warsaw archives.

Personal experience in the Kiev archives has taught the first author not to assume that the notations or titles on records are strictly accurate. This applies particularly to the dates listed on the files. It is wise to search records both

earlier and later than a particular year sought; sometimes the files of a particular year may also include records from those years. This results from Russian conformance with the Julian calendar until 1917, after which the Gregorian calendar came into use.
