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
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

# Introduction


Pysanky (Ukrainian Easter Eggs) are hand decorated eggs which are made with an ancient wax resist process. Ukrainians have been decorating beautiful eggs for centuries. As the tools and dyes have become more refined, the eggs have become more intense and delicate. Making pysanky has been a lifelong love of our family and this collection of 24 eggs has been chosen for their originality and traditional impact.

This is the first book of a planned series of previously unpublished patterns for the reader to recreate and enjoy. By breaking the design down to its simplest form, you will discover that you can create very complicated and magnificent patterns. As we describe each egg from beginning pencil lines to the final dye bath, the symbolism and color meanings will be explained briefly.






This photograph and the one on the opposite page were taken with the eggs turned so you can see how the designs progress around the egg. Some of the designs are complicated and two views will assist you in your work.



Because the eggs on the cover are arranged in a random pattern, we have made a corresponding chart and numbered the eggs so they can be identified and referred to for your understanding.

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# **Chapter One Working Area**

Protect the work table with a few layers of newspaper. To cushion the area where you work, place a few sheets of paper towels in a small stack in front of you.

Set up a good source of light so you see well. Avoid having shadows on the egg. If you work for long periods of time, you will be more comfortable if you sit up straight with both feet on the floor. Rest your arms on the table.

# **Chapter Two Essential Materials**

# **Eggs**

When shopping for eggs suitable for pysanky, the best source is to get unwashed eggs from a farm. If they are just laid, let them stand 4 or 5 days before decorating. Some eggs purchased at stores do not take the dyes well because they were washed with a strong solution that is not compatible with the dye. If farm eggs are not available, shop at a few stores until you find a good source.

When selecting eggs, use raw white eggs with good shells without cracks or weak spots. Jumbo and extra large eggs tend to have weaker shells, therefore, use medium or large eggs for decorating. Old eggs will float, making dying difficult. When ready to decorate eggs, allow them to come to room temperature.

If washing is necessary, rinse carefully without rubbing in a solution of 2 tablespoons white vinegar and one quart of tepid water. Blot the egg dry. Do not use detergent or soap. Chicken eggs are decorated most commonly although duck, goose and ostrich eggs are also popular.

It has generally been Ukrainian tradition to allow the decorated pysanky to remain whole. The inner egg was not disturbed because it was considered alive. Traditionally blown eggs were for good luck and protection from the evil eye.


Eggs may be blown either before or after decorating. If you decide to blow your eggs first, the holes in the shell must be sealed before dying. More information on blowing and working on empty eggs can be found in Chapter Six.

# Kistka or stylus


The kistka (writing tool) comes in a variety of styles and sizes. Some are handmade and some are made by machine. Basically, a kistka is a funnel attached to a stick. Wax is scooped into the funnel, heated and then the tool is drawn across the egg. There are two main kinds of kistky (plural of kistka), the ones which are heated with a candle and the electric ones.

#### I. Candle heated kistky

1. Traditional kistka; handmade, comes in fine, medium and heavy sizes. This stylus has been used for many years. It has a brass funnel wound with copper wire and a wooden handle.




2. Brass kistka; precision tooled, available in fine, medium and heavy sizes. It has a brass tip and a delrin handle.




#### II. Electric kistky

1. Stationary tip kistky; comes in sizes extra-fine, fine, medium, heavy and extra-heavy. The tips are not removable except for repair or replacement.



2. Interchangeable kistka; comes with three tips, fine, medium and heavy. An extrafine and extra-heavy tip can be purchased separately.



To make the eggs in this book, you will need at least three sizes of kistka; fine, medium and heavy. For the more intricate eggs, you may also use an extra-fine kistka.

## **Dyes**

Non-edible analine dyes are superb in quality and durability so we use them exclusively in decorating the pysanky. They come in the following colors: yellow, orange, bright red, light blue, light green, black, dark red, royal blue, brick, dark green, pink, purple, and turquoise. Once they are mixed in solution with boiling water, the dyes can be kept about a year in a sealed jar. **Note: The dyes will last longer and remain fresher if they are made with distilled water.** 

Dyes should be made in advance so they can be used at room temperature. To prevent cracking of the jars, warm them with a little hot water before putting in the dye and boiling water. A further precaution is to place the jars in the sink while making the dyes. Find clean widemouth jars so it will be easy to dip the eggs in and out of the dyes. Keep the dyes covered when not in use to avoid evaporation. Follow the directions on each color packet. Vinegar evaporates with time, so one or two tablespoons of white vinegar may be added every few weeks if the dyes appear weak. This helps the egg to take the dye better.

We have developed some helpful techniques in regards to specific dying processes and control of color intensity on the eggs.

**Small accents of blue or green:** For covering small areas with blue or green color, it is not necessary to dip the egg into these dyes. If you wish a light blue accent in your design, after the white egg has been completed with the wax process, dab on some light blue dye with a cotton swab in the areas desired, pat dry and cover with wax. Then dip into yellow as the next step. For green accents, dab the areas with light blue dye over the yellow egg, pat dry and cover with wax.

You do not have to be too concerned about applying the dye with the swab. Any area not covered with wax will dissolve in the orange dye.

**Orange Wash:** Have an extra orange dye and use it only to rinse out darker colors. Orange can rinse out greens, blues, reds and brick. After using the orange rinse, you can go to a different color scheme.

**Diluted blue:** For a beautiful blue, follow this recipe; To one cup of water, add 1 tablespoon of vinegar and 2 tablespoons of prepared light blue dye. Use this dye for dipping the egg to get a lighter, brighter blue.

**Bleaching;** If a white background is desired, a different sequence of color is used on the egg. For example, the egg is first dipped into a dye (yellow, orange, red or brick) and then the basic design is drawn in that color. Afterwards, the egg goes into lighter or darker colors, depending on the desired effect.

For a white background, gently wash the egg in a solution of 2 tablespoons bleach in one cup of cool water. After the uncovered shell has become completely white, rinse the bleached egg under cool running water. When the egg no longer feels slippery, wipe with a tissue. Important: allow the egg to air dry at least  $\frac{1}{2}$  hour before melting the wax from the shell.

#### **Beeswax**

Pure beeswax is the only type of wax used with this egg dying process. Regular light beeswax is used with kistky which are heated in the candle flame. This wax will gradually turn black from the carbon in the flame. For the electric kistky, darkened beeswax is available and is needed in order to see the design on the egg.

#### **Candle**

A candle on a secure holder is needed to heat the traditional or brass kistky. We suggest using shorter candles so the reach is easier. (Candle wax is not used for decorating the egg.) The candle is also used to melt the wax from the egg at the end of the process.

#### **Pencil**

When dividing the egg at the beginning, use a #2 or #3 pencil. The pencil lines will not show later if they are drawn lightly. They help to create a balanced design. The most experienced egg makers use pencil lines for their divisions. Do not erase pencil lines or the dye will not take to the shell in that area.

## **Spoons**

Use stainless steel tablespoons for dipping the eggs in and out of the dyes. Here is something we have been doing: On the table, have a jar with plain water in it and let the spoons sit in the water when they are not in use. This keeps the spoons clean at all times and it is easier to cover the jars of dyes.

# Cotton swabs or small paintbrush

A cotton swab or a small paintbrush are used to add touches of blue or green to the design. Cotton swabs, dipped into cleaning fluid, are also used to remove unwanted wax.

## Soft cloth and paper towels

Paper towels are used to pat the eggs dry when they come out of the dye. Paper towels are also used to cushion the egg on the table while working. Soft cloths are used to wipe the melted wax from the egg in the final step.

# White vinegar

White vinegar is used to add to most of the dyes to keep them strong. Also if the eggs need washing, we use a soluton of vinegar and water to rinse them.


# Varnish and hand soap.

Purchase a small can of clear gloss varnish. We recommend polyurethane or plastic finish. Do not use water soluble varnish. It will cause the dyes to run.

Waterless hand cleaner takes the varnish off your hands easily and gently. Both of these products may be purchased at your local hardware store.

# **Drying Rack**

The drying rack is a small board with nails pounded through it so that it will hold several eggs. It is used when melting wax from the eggs in the oven and also to allow the eggs to dry after varnishing.




# **Chapter Three Optional Materials**

The following supplies are optional, but very useful in decorating pysanky.

# **Egg Lathe**

The egg lathe is a device used to draw perfect horizontal lines around the egg. The lathe can be used for goose eggs, chicken eggs and most pullet eggs. It adjusts to four positions.

There are several eggs in this book which were made using the lathe: 3, 6, 7, 8, 14 and 15.




# **Cleaning Fluid**

Use cleaning fluid to remove an unwanted drip of wax from the shell. First, scrape the wax drip with your finger nail and then slightly dampen with a cotton swab which has been dipped into cleaning fluid, rub gently and remove the spot with a roll and lift motion. Keep the cotton swab damp and not soaked with cleaning fluid so it doesn't run into the rest of the design.

Also, after melting the eggs, you may remove carbon and traces of beeswax from the shell with a soft cloth which has been dampened with cleaning fluid. Do not rub. Wipe gently.

# **Egg Blower**

The egg blower is a specially designed rubber bulb used for emptying the contents of the egg. The egg can either be blown with one or two holes.



# **Findings**

A finding is a gold colored metal hanger which is glued to the top of a blown egg. After applying a drop of glue to the top of the egg, we place the finding on it and allow it to dry. Then, string a cord or fine ribbon through the loop in the finding for ease in hanging.




# **Chapter Four Basic Pencil Divisions**


Before applying wax lines, draw the basic divisions on the egg with pencil lines. These will be guide lines and will not show later if they are drawn lightly. It is better to make long smooth lines, do not erase.

The following division is used on more designs than any other. Practice it on eating eggs until you are comfortable with it.


### **Basic Pencil Division A**




1. With pencil, lightly draw a line around the egg vertically, dividing the egg in half.



3. Top view of egg when step 2 is completed.




2. Now draw another line dividing the egg into fourths vertically.




4. Divide the egg horizontally with pencil line.

# **Basic Division B**




Start with basic division A and then at the center point, draw lines dividing the egg into 16 equal parts. It should look the same on both sides.

# **Basic Division C**




Start with basic division A and then at the TOP of the egg, divide the egg into 16 sections with 2 additional vertical lines. The egg will look the same on both sides. Top view of egg.




# Chapter Five How to Make Egg Number 1




1. Draw the basic B division lines in pencil dividing the egg into 16 equal parts, 8 sections on each side. Now you are ready to use the kistka and wax. Heat the fine kistka in the flame, scoop a small amount of wax into the funnel and apply to the egg in the same sequence you drew the pencil lines originally. Wherever you see white on the final egg, this is where you will apply wax to the white egg.




2. When the dividing lines are finished in wax, write the next part of the division as shown.




3. Next, write in the star pattern with the fine kistka.



4. Draw in 2 straight parallel lines and a wavy line to complete the fine lines in the white drawing.




5. With a heavy kistka, add the finishing lines and dots.




6. Check your work to see if you haven't missed any lines, then dip the egg into the yellow dye. In 5-10 minutes, remove the egg and pat dry with a paper towel. Wherever you see yellow in the final design, this is where you will put wax over the yellow egg.

With a heavy kistka, draw the curved lines and dots as shown.



7. To apply green color to the design, dip a cotton swab in the light blue dye and dab it over the sections which are green in the finished egg. Pat dry with tissue and cover evenly with the heavy kistka.



8. Dip the egg into the orange dye. This dye bath will remove the residue from the blue dye. Since the design uses no orange color, proceed to dip the egg into the red dye. Apply dots and fill in areas as shown with wax.

Dip the egg into the black dye, the final color. Dry thoroughly with a paper towel. Allow the egg to dry about 15 minutes before removing the wax.

This is an original non-traditional egg by Luba Perchyshyn depicting a maiden girl from the Poltava region of Eastern Ukraine. The loaf of bread which she carries in her hands represent a welcome to guests. Her beads reflect her dowry and the flowers and ribbons in her "vinok" (wreath) around her head tell us that she is unmarried.

# **Chapter Six Finishing the Eggs**

## **Melting**

#### **Candle Method**

Removing the wax can be done two different ways. We often melt the wax using the flame of the candle. This is done by holding the egg in the side of the flame until the area looks wet, about 2 to 5 seconds. Then, with a clean soft cloth, wipe off the wax. This is where you will see all the work you have done. Be careful not to hold the egg over the top of the flame because the carbon will collect on the shell and darken the design. Do not attempt to heat too large a portion of the egg at one time. After you have finished melting all the wax, blow out the candle and gently wipe the egg with tissue dipped in a small amount of cleaning fluid to remove any carbon that may still be on the shell. It is important to have a clean shell before varnishing.

#### **Oven Method**

When you have to remove wax from several eggs, it is easier to use the oven. Preheat the oven for 10 minutes at 200 degrees with the door open. Place the eggs on the egg rack in the center of the oven until the wax begins to melt and look shiny. This should take between eight and fifteen minutes. Remove the eggs one at a time and wipe with a soft cloth or paper towel. It is not necessary for the eggs to get very hot, just warm enough to melt the wax. This method is faster and cleaner than the candle method of melting.

#### **Melting Blown Eggs**

For melting blown eggs, remember they only take a few seconds to heat, so watch not to scorch them either with the candle or in the oven. If you are melting them in the oven, melt only a few at a time. They will be warm enough in one or two minutes, so you will need to stay with them throughout the procedure.

## **Varnishing**

Have ready: newspaper, clear gloss varnish, drying rack, hand cleaner and paper towels. Spread the newspapers and open a small can of varnish. With your fingers, gently apply varnish to each egg. Be sure you have covered the entire shell with a thin coat and then place it on the rack to dry. Allow to dry completely (12 to 24 hours). If the eggs are sticky at all, do not apply additional varnish or they will NEVER dry. After the egg is thoroughly dry, apply a second coat for a high gloss finish.

To clean the varnish from your hands, first wipe the excess on a paper towel. Then, clean hands with hand cleaner which is gentle and will cut the varnish easily. Both the varnish and the hand cleaner can be purchased at your local hardware store.

## **Emptying Eggs**

Eggs may be blown either before or after decorating. If you wish to blow them first, the insides of the eggs can be saved for cooking. To empty the contents, pierce a hole at each end of a room temperature egg using a hat pin or a fine drill. Keep the holes as small as possible. Insert a long pin and pierce and break the yolk inside. Shake the egg vigorously to mix the inner contents. Hold the egg over a bowl and blow through the top hole to force the contents out.

A second method requires purchasing a special egg blowing bulb. The bulb forces air into the shell and the contents come out quickly. It is easier to blow eggs with the blower and if you wish, you may make only one hole in the shell.


After the egg has been emptied, rinse out the inside of the shell with a mild water and vinegar solution, (1 cup water and 2 tablespoons vinegar), blow again and allow to dry. Set the egg on the drying rack to dry.

The holes in the blown egg must be sealed before dying. What we do is to put a small drop of hot beeswax over the hole with the kistka to seal it. Because the shell is empty, it will float in the dye. Therefore, weigh it down with a small jar filled with enough water to hold the egg under the dye.

If you decide to blow the egg after it has been decorated, it must be done after the egg has been varnished. The dyes are water soluble and will run from either the egg or the rinse water so the shell needs varnish for protection. The insides of these eggs cannot be used for cooking, because the dyes may penetrate the shell and are not edible.

If you do plan to blow out your eggs, do not allow them to get too hot in the oven when melting the wax. Cooked eggs are almost impossible to blow; we know this from experience. You may decide to melt your eggs with the candle instead so the insides remain raw. It is best to blow out all the eggs while they are still fresh.

Whichever way you may choose to blow your eggs, before or after decorating, we have a helpful hint. After the egg is decorated and blown, seal the holes on the ends of the egg with a drop of glue which dries clear.




## **Hanging Eggs**

If you wish to suspend a pysanka as the Ukrainian peasants did in their homes and barns, we suggest either of two methods.

Tie a long length of narrow ribbon, cord or thread to the middle of a toothpick. A small amount of glue may be smeared on the stick where the thread is tied to keep it from slipping. Carefully, insert the toothpick straight down into the hole (Figure 1). The stick will become wedged crosswise inside the shell and will not pull out (Figure 2).

Another method, especially good for hanging blown eggs on the Christmas tree, is to glue a finding to the top of the egg, allow to dry overnight, then thread a cord or fine ribbon through the loop in the finding and you have a beautiful handmade ornament ready to enjoy (Figure 3).



## **Egg Tips**

We cannot remind you too much, you will have the best results with your pysanky if you:

- 1. Use only fresh eggs with good firm shells.
- 2. Check your work before dying the egg to be sure all your lines are completed.
- 3. Keep the finished pysanka out of the sun.
- 4. Do not store whole pysanky in a tight place where the air is not circulating freely. A plastic carton or a china cabinet which has tightly closed doors inhibits normal air circulation. Paper cartons are suitable to use for storage.
- 5. For whole eggs, handle as little as possible, except to turn every few months for even drying.
- 6. Keep the eggs from extreme heat or cold. This refers to eggs which are not blown; use no spotlights or do not store eggs in the attic where they might freeze or get excessively hot.
- 7. Do not take cold eggs from the refrigerator and submerge them in hot water to warm them for decorating. Allow them to come to room temperature normally.
- 8. If you live in a hot or humid climate, eggs should be blown for best results.


































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
