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"THE UKRAINIAN QUARTERLY": AN INSTITUTION

The *Cumulative Index* of *The Ukrainian Quarterly* appeared in 1964, embracing the two decades of its existence (1944-1964).

At that time we published three basic articles stressing the importance and mission of the review for the Ukrainian cause of freedom in particular, and the cause of universal freedom in general. These articles, written by Prof. Clarence A. Manning, Prof. Lev E. Dobriansky, and Walter Dushnyck, provided an overall characterization of the role *The Ukrainian Quarterly* played, especially in its promoting a better understanding of the Ukrainian problem in the Western world.

In presenting this smaller issue of the *Cumulative Index*, covering the years 1965-1970, thus rounding out the years of *The Quarterly's* appearance, the general description of *The Ukrainian Quarterly* given in the 1944-1964 *Index* still holds in every respect. *The Quarterly* has continued to serve as an important instrument in the battle for the recognition and understanding of Ukraine and its incessant struggle against Soviet Russian imperialism and colonialism. It has continued to expose the inhuman and tyrannical oppression of the Ukrainian people by Communist Russia, whether under the dictatorship of a Khrushchev or, as now, that of a Brezhnev-Kosygin *duumvirate*.

In the past few years much emphasis in *The Ukrainian Quarterly* has been put on the relentless persecution and repression of Ukrainian intellectuals in Ukraine, and the efforts of the Ukrainian community in the free world to defend these hapless victims of Soviet tyranny.

The Ukrainian Quarterly continues to be a source of factual knowledge and information on Ukraine. Having overcome an initial indifference, it has acquired a permanent place in hundreds of American public high schools, university libraries, scientific institutions, and in government and newspaper offices in some 64 countries of the world. Requests for copies come in regularly from embassies and legations, from member states of the United Nations, and from U.S. scholars and students.

Chronologically, this is the third *Index* of *The Ukrainian Quarterly* to appear. The first *Cumulative Index* 1944-1954, compiled by the then editor, Prof. Nicholas D. Chubaty, covered the first ten years of *The Ukrainian Quarterly's* publication. The second *Cumulative Index* encompassed the first two decades of the publication, that is, 1944 to 1964, inclusive. The present *Cumulative Index* covers only the six years, 1965 to 1970, inclusive. The latter two indices were compiled by Dr. Walter Dushnyck, present editor of *The Ukrainian Quarterly*.

It is hoped that the present *Index* will continue to help our readers in their study and research in the problem of Ukraine and the Ukrainian people, as well as in ranging inquiries in the Eurasian political, economic and cultural complex, with which *The Ukrainian Quarterly* has been in systematic contact from the very beginning of its existence.
