

n behalf of the Board of Directors of St. Vladimir Institute, it is my privilege to extend warmest greetings to the members, volunteers and supporters of our venerable organization on the occasion of its 40th anniversary.

When the doors to the original Institute opened in 1963 at 651 Spadina Avenue, Lester Pearson was the sitting Prime Minister, the Toronto Maple Leafs were recent Stanley Cup winners and a dozen frozen varenyky cost less than a dollar.

How times have changed! And no where is this more apparent than at the Institute itself. What began 40 years ago as a residential centre for

Ukrainian-Canadian students of the Orthodox faith studying at the University of Toronto, has evolved, matured and progressed to the point where today St. Vladimir's is the leading centre of community activity in the heart of Canada's largest city. This is a designation that all of us must work hard to protect and nurture if we are to maintain our niche as a respected minority presence in Toronto's remarkable multicultural mix of languages and cultures.

None of this growth and stature would have been possible without the selfless contributions from the women and men of the Ukrainian Self Reliance League of Canada. We can thank these dedicated individuals for the leadership they illustrated in building a community centre that thrives to this very day. But the most valuable lesson they left us was this: a collective vision can become reality through hard work, dedication and common cause.

Though many of these early leaders arrived to Toronto from western Canada, they quickly identified a need in the post-war period for a gathering place in Toronto where the pan-Ukrainian Orthodox community could gather as one to celebrate the legacy of our history in this country while at the same time building a community for the future.

Once the vision was identified these individuals got down to the hard work of raising money, dedicating their own time and filling the space within the walls of our facility with the colour and flavor of our shared Ukrainian ancestry. The current generation of members and supporters of St. Vladimir's owe this pioneering generation an enormous debt of gratitude for the institution they created.

People of this kind, a precious few of whom we shall honor at our 40th anniversary gala banquet, shall not again be seen anytime soon.

St. Vladimir Institute has maintained a unique presence in Toronto because of its willingness to occupy the broad middle ground of Ukrainian-Canadian community life. Unshackled by rigid affiliation with one or another sector of our local community, the Institute's popularity with successive generations rests with its "open door" approach to welcoming everyone who traces their ancestry to Ukraine. We are,



in many ways, one big tent beneath which all are welcome to contribute their skills, passions and talent.

This approach, which has served the Institute so well in the past, is the key to guaranteeing our future success as a centre for excellence and pride. As Ukrainians in Canada continue to mature and evolve as a distinct ethnic minority, there will be a need, greater than ever, for a centre that comes to represent the interests of this complex community that spans multiple generations of immigrants. In my view that centre will be identified as St. Vladimir Institute, located strategically at the hub of Canada's leading business, academic and media centre.

In the meantime however, there is much to be accomplished. The bricks, ducts and wiring that physically hold the Institute together require constant maintenance, at considerable cost. We are constantly reviewing our programs to ensure they meet the expectations of the local Ukrainian community, whose members and supporters envelope the full history of Ukrainian settlement in Canada-urban and rural; contemporary and historical.

In meeting each of these challenges-maintaining our physical entity, while providing services to the Ukrainian-Canadian community-we again appeal to you, our valued members and supporters. Without your continued support and generosity, we will fall short of our shared goals. In the interest of fostering future generations of leadership, I respectfully call upon each of you to carry a small financial burden in order that, together, we can sustain a larger dream shared by many.

St. Vladimir Institute occupies a special place in the hearts of many Ukrainian-Canadians who today call Toronto and southern Ontario, home. We must resist the example of other community organizations which have abandoned the core of Toronto for suburban locations where they are outside the radar of Canadian society. The Ukrainian-Canadian community requires a "face" in Canada's largest city, and St. Vladimir Institute is the obvious candidate to fulfill this distinction.

At 40, the Institute has reached middle age. We draw strength and inspiration from the legacy and leaders that preceded us, and look forward to meet the challenges posed ahead. With your continued support and generosity you, too, can be a valued contributor to the sustainability of a vision-a vision that includes a prominent Ukrainian-Canadian presence in Toronto.

Мені припадає честь від імені Дирекції Інституту св. Володимира тепло привітати усіх членів, добровольців та прихильників нашої шановної установи з нагоди її 40-ліття.

Коли відчинилися двері першої будівлі Інституту на Спадайна Авеню, 651, прем'єрміністром Канади був Лестер Пірсон, Торонто Мейпл Ліфс тільки-но виграли Кубок Стенлі, а 12 заморожених вареників коштувало менше долара.

Як змінився час! І це найбільш очевидно саме в Інституті. Започаткований 40 років тому як гуртожиток для православних українських студентів Канади, які навчалися в Торонтонському Університеті, Інститут св. Володимира зміцнів, виріс і перетворився на провідний центр української громади у самому центрі найбільшого в Канаді міста. Нам всім слід докласти максимальних зусиль, щоб зберегти і утримати це становище, якщо ми хочемо і далі займати достойне місце серед багатонаціональної і різномовної громади Торонта.

Наш розвиток і досягнення були б неможливими без самовідданого вкладу жінок та чоловіків Союзу Українців Самостійників Канади. Ми вдячні цим відданим людям за провідництво у побудові громадського центру, який процвітає по сьогодні. А вони нам продемонстрували цінний приклад: колективна ідея стає дійсністю завдяки важкій праці, самовідданості і спільній меті.

Не зважаючи на те, що засновники Інституту приїхали до Торонта із західної Канади, вони швидко відчули необхідність зібрати всю торонтонську українську православну громаду у повоєнному періоді для творення спільної історії у цій країні одночасно з побудовою спільноти для майбутнього.

Визначивши мету, ці творчі особистості взялися за нелегку працю збору коштів, жертвуючи особистим часом, і наповнили цю будівлю барвами та оздобами нашої спільної української спадщини. Сучасне покоління членів та прихильників Інституту надзвичайно зобов'язане і вдячне попередньому поколінню творців за заснований ними Інститут.

Невелику групу діячів такого масштабу, яких ми будемо вшановувати на нашому Святковому бенкеті 40-літнього ювілею, не скоро появиться нагода побачити знову.

Інститут св. Володимура зумів зайняти рідкісне становище у Торонті завдяки готовності у розмаїтій громаді канадських українців займати місце посередині. Завдяки неприв'язаності до одного чи іншого сектору місцевої громади Інститут набув популярності у наступних поколінь. Політика «відчинених дверей» гостинно запрошує всіх, чиє коріння пов'язане з Україною. Фактично

ми – це один великий намет, який відкритий для об'єднання эдібностей, захоплень і талантів.

Такий підхід дав гарні результати у минулому і є ключовим для забезпечення наших успіхів, як центру краси та гордості, у майбутньому. Українці у Канаді стають все сильнішою і впливовішою етнічною меншиною, тому зростає і потреба мати об'єднуючий центр різних поколінь імміґрантів. Я вважаю, що таким центром стане Інститут св. Володимира, стратегічно вигідно розташований у самому центрі канадських засобів інформації, освіти та бізнесу.

Проте ще багато слід зробити. Будівля Інституту вимагає постійного догляду та грошових затрат. Ми постійно оновлюємо наші культурно-освітні програми, щоб забезпечити потреби і вимоги місцевої громади, які є представниками різних груп та об'єднань українців у Канаді - міських і сільських, новоприбулих і давно осілих.

Щоб впоратись із цими потребами, підтримуючи приміщення і піклуючись про інтереси канадсько-української громади, ми знову звертаємося до вас, наших шановних членів та прихильників. Без вашої постійної підтримки і щедрості ми не досягнемо наших цілей. Заради виховання майбутніх поколінь провідників я закликаю кожного з вас взяти на себе невелике фінансове зобов'язання Ці кошти, разом взяті, допоможуть нам забезпечити фінансову підтримку наших стремлінь у майбутнє.



ST. VLADIMIR INSTITUTE THE HONOUREES

On the occasion of its fortieth anniversary, St. Vladimir Institute celebrates four Ukrainian-Canadians whose commitment, dedication and hard work have not only played a significant role in the establishment, development and progression of the Institute, but who have also contributed to the Ukrainian-Canadian and Canadian community in general.

John Yaremko, BA, QC, LLB, Dr. rer. pol.

lected six times in a 25-year political career spanning from 1951 through to 1976, John Yaremko was not only the first Canadian of Ukrainian origin elected as MPP, he was also the first Ukrainian-Canadian in Eastern Canada to be appointed to a Provincial Government.

From 1958 to 1974, Mr. Yaremko served in the Ontario cabinet under Premiers Frost, Robarts and Davis-often being the youngest



minister. He was Provincial Secretary and Minister of Transport, Citizenship, Public Welfare and Social and Family Services, as well as Solicitor General for the province.

A deep commitment to human rights, health, education, social services and quality of life led Mr. Yaremko to draw upon his own life experiences, often difficult, to advocate desirable actions overall and, in his ministries in particular, to

institute new programs. Under his tenure, a new department of Social and Family Services brought unique services to the aged, the young, the disadvantaged and the disabled.

At that time, aware of the lack of university student aid, Mr. Yaremko pointed out the value and the need for scholarships, bursaries and student loans. Because of his advocacy, any student could aspire to post-secondary education.

Proud of his own Ukrainian cultural origins, Mr. Yaremko developed the concept of multiculturalism—in fact, he coined the term. Multiculturalism as policy was adopted by Ontario in 1969 and by Ottawa in 1971. By introducing multiculturalism, Mr. Yaremko enunciated the aspirations of all citizens for participation and acceptance.

Mr. Yaremko has played a significant role in the establishment of many Ukrainian and other cultural organizations including St. Vladimir Institute, of which he and his wife have been supporters from the beginning.

Anne Figus-Ralko

Born in Vita, Manitoba, Anne Figus-Ralko has been a constant figure in the Ukrainian-Canadian community. After completing stenographic and bookkeeping courses at Dominion Business College in Winnipeg, she was employed by Ukrainian Voice Publishing Company as an administrative secretary in 1946.

After three years with the firm, Ms Figus-Ralko moved on to the head office of the Ukrainian Self-Reliance League of Canada and head office of the Canadian Ukrainian Youth Association (SUMK) where she was executive secretary and SUMK organizer.

As executive secretary with the Consistory of the Ukrainian Greek Orthodox Church of Canada from 1952 to 1963 Ms. Figus-Ralko established the administrative system of *The Herald* and in



1957 founded the Consistory Church Goods Supply which she managed until 1963.

September of that same year brought Ms Figus-Ralko to St. Vladimir Institute in Toronto where she established an administrative office based on similar offices in western Canada. In 1969 she initiated the publication of With an Eye to the Future (Pered Bramoiu), a brief historical sketch of the Institute. While at the Institute.

Ms Figus-Ralko was also secretary of the Publishing and Editorial Committees, and she assisted Natalia Kohuska with researching historical material.

After leaving St. Vladimir Institute in 1969 Ms Figus-Ralko went on to positions as manager of So-Use (Toronto) Credit Union; bursar, St. Andrew's College, Winnipeg; executive secretary of the Head Office of the Millennium of the Ukrainian Orthodox Church-Consistory, Winnipeg.

In 2001 Ms Figus-Ralko authored the book *Ukrainian Canada*, printed in Kyiv, Ukraine and distributed to all universities and in libraries in all 25 *oblasti* of Ukraine.

William Kereliuk

illiam Kereliuk has not only earned a notable entry into the chronicles of St. Vladimir Institute–for many alumni, he is Mr. Institute.

The eldest of eight children in a Ukrainian-Canadian pioneer family, Mr. Kereliuk was born in 1917 in the Saskatchewan hamlet of Insinger.

In his lifework Mr. Kereliuk saw an outstanding military career with the Royal Canadian Air Force as Flight Lieutenant in photo reconnaissance, air rescue, and submarine surveillance, then as a liaison officer for WWII allied forces, as well as first secretary and treasurer of the Ukrainian Canadian Servicemen's Association in London, England.

Adding to an already impressive list of credentials, Mr. Kere-



liuk also served as interpreter to the United Nations, training coordinator for NATO air defence navigation and director of the foreign languages school, moving on to interpreter and translator at the Directorate of Air Intelligence in Ottawa.

After retirement and a few years in the hotel business,

he came to St. Vladimir Institute in 1969 and remained as executive director for 12 years. He played a key role in the development of the Institute, working closely with its membership, supporters, staff, community and residents.

Throughout the years, Mr. Kereliuk has been active in the Ukrainian Self-Reliance League of Canada, the Ukrainian Orthodox Church, SUS Foundation of Canada, World Congress of Free Ukrainians, So-Use Credit Union, Ukrainian Professional and Business Association and Chair of Ukrainian Studies.

He continues to remain active in the Ukrainian-Canadian community even today.

Taras Shipowick

ith more than 25 years of experience in entertainment and event production, Taras Shipowick trained at York University (BFA), Royal Conservatory of Music, Banff School of Fine Arts and the Juilliard School of Music in New York. He apprenticed for (and later assisted) Broadway impresario Joseph Papp at his renowned New York Shakespeare Festival and the Public Theatre, handling theatrical transfers from London, Broadway and Off Broadway. He is recipient of numerous awards (listed in Canada's Who's Who) for designing and producing prestigious



events ranging from the Command Performance for HRH Queen Elizabeth II (during her Royal Visit to Canada), two years producing Canada Day Celebrations on Parliament Hill (live and national TV audience), a massive 30 city arena show tour for the Ontario Government, a Community Arts Festival for the Brooklyn Academy of Arts (BAM in New York), and work for CBC and CTV.

Earlier he scouted theatre companies in Europe and the Americas as artistic director for UNESCO's International Theatre Festival and as producer of the Canadian Multicultural Theatre Festivals for four years.

It was during these early years that Taras also experimented with new theatre techniques as artistic director of the Odessa Group at St. Vladimir Institute. His original musicals were performed during Caravan. His Odessa shows include: Entertainment on the Docks, The Offering-Ivana Kupalo, Song of Leaving and Celebration. That year, he also wrote and directed Ukrainian Wedding for the Christie Pavilion and produced a Caravan Pavilion for the Canadian Opera Company.

Today he is president of Showmakers Inc., a premier production house specializing in large scale corporate events: business meetings, product launches and special events. He resides in Toronto and is a fourth generation Canadian Ukrainian.





ST. VLADIMIR INSTITUTE THE CHARTER (1961)

These excerpts from the original Charter of St. Vladimir Institute outline the objectives of the Institute's organizing committee. Today, forty years after the Institute first opened its doors, these same goals continue to be relevant.



The signing of the charter, September 25, 1961

St. Vladimir Ukrainian Institute Charter

A corporation without share capital, incorporated by Letters Patent issued by The Honourable The Secretary of the Province of Ontario, on the 25th day of September, A.D., 1961, pursuant to the provisions of The Corporation Act.

The Objects of St. Vladimir Ukrainian Institute as set out in the said Letters of Patent are as follows:

(a) TO establish, operate, maintain and conduct under proper moral and religious guidance and supervision residential facilities for Ukrainian-Canadian students attending public, vocational and trade schools, colleges and universities or other educational institutions in the said city of Toronto;

(b) TO assist, financially or otherwise, talented, gifted or promising Ukrainian-Canadian students in obtaining adequate residential facilities and full educational opportunities in the Province of Ontario;

(c) TO provide moral and religious guidance and instruction in matters of faith, dogma, ritual and teachings of the Ukrainian Greek-Orthodox Church of Canada;

(d) TO provide and maintain a centre for all cultural activities for Canadians of Ukrainian descent in the Province of Ontario;

(e) TO foster, promote and perpetuate in the national life of Canada the finest cultural elements and traditions of the Ukrainian people and, without restricting the generality of the foregoing, more particularly, the Ukrainian language, music, dancing, handicraft and other domestic arts and crafts as a distinctive contribution to the national culture of Canada; and

(f) TO inculcate in Canadian students of Ukrainian descent respect for the law and democratic institutions, good study habits, the highest standards of leadership, morality and ethical business practices, and to encourage the students, by precept and example, to take an active interest in the civic, commercial, social and moral welfare of the community.



COMMENTARY:

ST. VLAD'S AT FORTY...AND THE YEARS AHEAD

Forty years have passed, times have changed and there are challenges ahead. We hope these views inspire some ideas that can be helpful as St. Vladimir Institute prepares for the next chapter of its history. We invite everyone committed to the future of the Institute to contribute to this discussion.

s we celebrate the last forty years, we might also consider how the Institute will meet the challenge of the next forty, fifty, sixty years and beyond. The environment in which it exists and operates is changing and will continue to do so, forcing the Institute to evolve if it means to continue to exist. The following appear to be the major changes which it must take into account:

- St. Vladimir Institute was founded in the early 1960's on principles which had underlain the creation before 1920 of its sister institutes in the West, many of which could not apply in Ontario's Ukrainian community of the 1960's, do not apply today and will not tomorrow.
- 2. Changing demographics have affected the Institute. Forty years ago its location was close to Toronto's vibrant Ukrainian community which has since dispersed. Assimilation has affected the community and language loss has accelerated. The Institute bears the name of a saint and has a connection with the Ukrainian Orthodox Church of Canada. The church, like many others, has seen a loss in attendance and affiliation. This in turn impinges on the Institute.
- 3. The independence of Ukraine has brought into question the very *raison d'être* of many organizations that were committed to the independence struggle, affecting the ideological dynamic of the community itself.
- 4. The Institute can no longer count on its residence to be filled with "Ukrainian" students and their proportion to the total is falling.
- 5. The new wave of Ukrainian immigration from Ukraine, Poland and elsewhere is seen by some as salvation for Canada's Ukrainian community. Others see it as contributing to confrontation and friction with those already here. This influx at times results in the temptation to give up attempts to keep the older element interested and active within the community.
- 6. Patterns of supporting the Institute financially have changed. Those pioneers who donated their meager savings to build churches and institutions, including St. Vlad's, are disappearing and new patterns of donating are emerging.

These changes challenge the Institute today. As new challenges arise in the future, the Institute must adapt, be flexible, be innovative, and be tolerant. To begin with:

- We must ensure financial stability. New patterns of donating must be analyzed and secured. A healthy endowment should provide income for basic operations and core programs. Other fundraising should be looked to for support of special projects, whether in terms of capital facilities or new programs.
- 2. In its programs, the Institute should strive for uniqueness and excellence. It should not hesitate to be innovative, to experiment, to carve out its own special niche. It should lead, not follow. At the same time, it should avoid duplicating what other Ukrainian centres in Toronto are doing unless it can do that better or reach a clientele beyond their reach.
- 3. The Institute must be tolerant of and serve those who either are not Ukrainian or do not know the language. The Canadian experience has shown that succeeding generations of immigrants undergo language loss. In the long term, the Institute should become a beacon for the retention and showcasing of Ukrainian culture through the medium of English—often the only language persons of Ukrainian origin in the younger age brackets understand. On the other hand, the use of Ukrainian should not be rejected. The present happy middle ground, current at the Institute, should continue and pressure from either side of the question must be resisted. Non-Ukrainian students should continue to be accepted in the residence. Through balanced cultural and educational programs they will learn much that is good about us. Our horizons, too, will be broadened by their presence.
- 4. The Institute should not be trapped by its *Ukrainian-ness*. Certainly, both Ukrainians and others will be interested in its Ukrainian programs. At the same time its Ukrainian clients will surely also have broader, non-Ukrainian, interests. If these interests are not met by the Institute, those clients will go elsewhere and perhaps not return. The Institute is part of the local community and, as a good citizen of that community, should have programs that would appeal to its inhabitants.
- 5. The Institute is located physically within the compass of the University of Toronto. With its library, meeting rooms, museum, kitchen and students' residence, it has resources that could be used to establish close ties with the University for mutual benefit. This possibility should be pursued for the long term. Closer ties with the University would be of benefit to both, but would particularly enhance the Institute's image.

ST. VLADIMIR INSTITUTE THE EVOLVING HISTORY

The 1940s

Inspired by models already existing in western Canadian cities—the Adam Kotsko Institute in Winnipeg (1915), the Petro Mohyla Institute in Saskatoon (1916) and the Mykhailo Hrushevsky Institute (now St. John Institute), in Edmonton (1918)—the Ukrainian Self-Reliance League of Canada addresses the need for a Ukrainian student residence in Toronto.

1944 St. Vladimir Institute receives its first donation—\$500 from Ivan Fedan, a U.S. businessman from Pennsylvania who wants to send his daughters to Toronto for Ukrainian language instruction.

1945 Fundraising for St. Vladimir Institute hits four figures, coming in at \$2,000 for the year.

1950 The name St. Vladimir Institute is now official, with operations headquartered at 404 Bathurst Street, Toronto.



Breaking ground for the annex, 1979

1961 St. Vladimir Institute is incorporated by Letters Patent of Ontario.

1963 St. Vladimir Institute, a residence for Ukrainian students studying in Toronto, becomes a reality. Property, complete with existing building at 651 Spadina Avenue, Toronto, is purchased. On September 23 students sit down to their first dinner with members of the Board of Directors, national presidents of the Ukrainian Self-Reliance League of Canada, the Ukrainian Self-Reliance Association

and the Ukrainian Women's Association of Canada. On October 13 the Very Reverend Dmytro Foty conducts the first chapel service held on the premises.

1964 Steven Davidovich becomes the first educational and cultural director of St. Vladimir Institute.

1965 May 8 St. Vladimir Institute holds its first fundraising banquet and dance at the Constellation Hotel.

1965 December 15 Women's Auxiliary of St. Vladimir Institute is established.

1967 With an eye to the future expansion of St. Vladimir Institute, the property at 620 Spadina Avenue is purchased.

1968 September 22 sees the official dedication and ground-breaking ceremony of 620 Spadina Avenue. Let the building begin!

1969 The cornerstone is consecrated. Finally it's official, and on October 11-12, St. Vladimir Institute at 620 Spadina Avenue holds its official grand opening. The old site at the 651 Spadina Avenue location has been expropriated by the University of Toronto. The former building becomes part of Innis College and is renamed Vlad House by the University. William Kereliuk becomes the first Rector of St. Vladimir Institute and serves in this position for 12 years.

1972 Property at 117 Robert Street is acquired to accommodate an overflow of residents, and then sold a few years later.

1972 Metro International Caravan approves St. Vladimir Institute's application to participate in Caravan. During this summer event, St. Vladimir Institute is better known as the Odessa Pavillion.

1975 Dr. Martin Chepesiuk's \$1000 donation is a catalyst in establishing the new, permanent staff position of Cultural Director, St. Vladimir Institute.

1976 St. Vladimir Institute purchases neighbouring property at 610 Spadina Avenue (the Lutheran Chapel).

1977 St. Vladimir Institute launches a \$865,000 building campaign to build a three-storey structure filling the gap between the 610 and 620 Spadina Avenue buildings.

1979 Building Permit No. 107530 is issued by the Commissioner of Buildings, City of Toronto for the fill-in structure.

1980 The annex and the original structure are now one. April 26-May 3 of this year marks opening week of the newly expanded St. Vladimir Institute, complete with ribbon-cutting ceremony.

1981 A year of firsts. St. Vladimir Institute Theatre is complete and marks its debut with two one-act plays: *After Baba's Funeral* and *Sweet and Sour Pickles*. This same year also sees the official opening of the museum and library.

1984 The St. Vladimir Institute Theatre hosts the inaugural performance of *Just a Komedia* starring Luba Goy, Wally Michaels and Mimi Kuzyk. Shortly thereafter, it is off to Hollywood for Ms. Kuzyk, who lands a lead role in *Hill Street Blues*.

1985 Summer Stage workshops and performances begin. Meanwhile, the Ukrainian Famine Research Committee (later renamed, Ukrainian Canadian Research and Documentation Centre) releases the multi-award-winning documentary film *Harvest of Despair*.

1986 Heritage Club, headquartered at St. Vladimir Institute and under Steve Yonka's direction, becomes a very busy, active group.

1988 Another milestone. St. Vladimir Institute celebrates its 25th Anniversary.

1989 The unveiling of the statue of St. Volodymyr in front of 620 Spadina Avenue not only marks the beginning of the second millennium of Christianity in Ukraine, it also places St. Vladimir Institute's patron saint right at its doorstep. The statue, donated by Mr. Michael & Mrs. Jaroslawa Szafraniuk, is the work of renowned Ukrainian-Canadian artist Leo Mol.

1989 The first Lotto 620 is held. Rumour has it the lucky winner can still be spotted around town in the grand prize—a Jaguar.

1991 Leonid Kravchuk, the first president of an independent Ukraine, visits St. Vladimir Institute.

1992 The first Ukrainian Toastmasters Club is formed and head-quartered at St. Vladimir Institute.

1992 Celebrating 20 continuous years of successful Caravans at St. Vladimir Institute.

ST. VLADIMIR INSTITUTE PLANNING FOR THE NEXT FORTY YEARS

orty years ago, a group of far-sighted individuals concluded that the Ukrainian community needed a student residence in Toronto. Following the examples set in western Canada by the St. John and Petro Mohyla Institutes, the organizers believed young men and women of Ukrainian background from across Ontario and Canada needed a "home away from home", where they could live in a Ukrainian environment while furthering their education in Toronto. This vision was implemented with the acquisition of the first Institute building and the acceptance of the first residents for the 1963 academic year.

As time went by, it soon became apparent that the students needed a larger and more modern residence, and Ukrainians of Toronto needed a centre to share our culture and history with the wider community. These evolving needs led to the construction of the new building in 1969, a building that could serve a larger purpose than just housing students. As the Institute's programs continued to grow, it was decided to further expand the Institute with the acquisition of the neighbouring Lutheran Church and the construction of new facilities to house the museum, library, theatre and a variety of programs and activities.

It is easy now to underestimate how much planning and fore-sight went into the establishment of the Institute and all the transformations we have undergone since 1963. At every step of the way, the Institute's directors and members not only had to identify the community's needs and desires, they also had to build a facility and design programs to fill those needs. Their ability to successfully interpret and implement these needs and desires would be measured by the vitality of the institution, the popularity of the programs, and the financial health of the organization. And, if the initial success of the Institute in 1963 was due to the founders' ability to accurately predict what our community needed at that time, our continued relevance and success is due to our ability to evolve as our community has changed.

After 40 years, it is now time once again to take stock of where we are and what we have become, and to think seriously about what the future will hold for us. Over the next year, the Board of Directors will put in place a strategic plan for the next decade or more, to set the stage for another 40 years of growth and achievements. The first step in this process will be a detailed examination of our situation today. We need to clearly understand who our constituency is, what kinds of programs people need and want and what role the Institute can play as our interface with the broader community. This will entail consultations with a broad range of



our members and supporters, and a careful examination of our achievements to date and the challenges we now face.

Following that, we will develop a plan and program for the Institute's future. This may have major implications for all aspects of the Institute's activities. It will consider what kind of facility we need, what changes to the building are required, and what programs, services, and activities we should offer. An important component of this planning will be to develop a sustainable financial plan for the Institute's future, to ensure that the institution has the capacity to fulfill whatever role we chose for ourselves.

We hope that as many people as possible will participate in this exciting process—sharing their experience, ideas, and commitment to our continued success. Following the example set by St. Vladimir's founders, together we will bring a renewed vision to the Institute and its future. The result will be a dynamic Institute serving our members and supporters and the entire Ukrainian community of Toronto and Canada.
